Ken Farlow 70th VE Day Commemoration Trip

Branch member Ken Farlow attended the Service of Thanksgiving to mark the 70th anniversary of VE Day on Sunday 10th May 2015. Here is Ken's report:



After booking into the "Grand Hotel" my son Andrew wheeled me down to the Cenotaph for the service of remembrance. It was very cold and one kind lady took off her warm silk scarf and wrapped it around my neck.

On the Saturday we went to "Horse Guards Parade" where a large stage was erected for the party show. A Spitfire and Hurricane ware located on each side of the stage. The audience of some 14,000 were all waving flags, mostly Union Jacks. One lady noticed I didn't have a flag so she thrust one into my hands. Hundreds were dancing in the aisles—doing the Conga and singing.



On the Sunday we were directed to Westminster Abbey for the service of Thanksgiving. On leaving the Abbey I shook hands with the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Archbishop of London and other dignitaries . After the service we were moved to Horse Guards lead by the band of the Royal Marines and a Scottish band to be greeted by Prince Charles. After lunch the Prime Minister David Cameron sat next to me to have a little chat — no, I did not tell him how to run the country! Then the Chief of the

Air Staff, Air Chief Marshall Sir Andrew Pulford sat next to me. He told me about a forthcoming meeting with Sir Dusty Miller. I told him he lived nearby but he already knew that.

We finished our trip with a visit to the Churchill War Rooms and a ride on the London Eye.

Later, to my surprise, I received the Painswick Beacon newspaper with brief details of my trip to London. As I stepped out of the door the following morning everyone was saying "Good Morning Ken". Yes, it was a good trip and I am one of the lucky ones.
